About Photoworks

Photoworks champions photography for everyone. We are an international platform, global in reach, and have provided opportunities for artists and audiences since 1995. We do not have a physical venue, but our online channels are always open. Our programme brings new experiences to audiences and opens new ways to encounter photography.

Photoworks is a registered charity and the only organisation with a national remit for photography in England. Our work is supported by public funding through Arts Council England's National Portfolio.

We partner with organisations and venues across the UK to deliver our programmes. We are a small team of seven full-time and part-time staff, supported by freelancers and artist facilitators.

About the role

This is an opportunity for an experienced artist facilitator to deliver a series of inclusive photography clubs enabling small groups of neurodivergent adults and their support workers (also known as personal assistants or PAs) to make and engage with photography at Aspex Portsmouth. This role is freelance starting asap and finishing by end April 24*.

*Inclusive Photography Club programme delivery ends by August 23, outcomes presented for exhibition and possible contribution to dissemination events ends by April 24.

Job description

Purpose of the role

Working closely with the Curatorial & Learning team, the In Focus Artist Facilitator will be responsible for delivering a series of inclusive photography clubs at Aspex Portsmouth for small groups of neurodivergent adults, who may be non-verbal or require complex support and their PAs (personal assistants). The resulting artwork will be exhibited at Aspex Portsmouth in the learning space alongside the In Focus co-commission (solo artist exhibition).

The Artist Facilitator will be responsible for devising an engaging and accessible five-week photography-focused programme that actively engages both neurodivergent adults in the group and their accompanying PAs.

The Artist Facilitator will play a key role in delivering Photoworks' commitment to reaching audiences who face barriers to engagement. A central aim of the activity is to inspire and engage personal assistants, ensuring that once the clubs end, the PAs are left with skills, knowledge and experience to be able to continue to support and promote creative & cultural access for the adults they work with.

The Artist Facilitator will be responsible for ensuring that all activity complies with Photoworks' rigorous safeguarding standards.

About In Focus

In Focus is a programme run by Photoworks and is part of a wider programme called <u>Explorers</u>; comprising awareness-raising activity, commissions, exhibitions, seminars and events developed by Project Art Works in partnership with Photoworks and other cultural partners, with and for neurodivergent communities, placing them at the heart of social, civic and cultural activity.

In Focus commissions support the creation of new work specifically by neurodivergent adults, including those who may be non-verbal or require complex support.

Main responsibilities

- Working closely with the Learning & Engagement Consultant and In Focus
 Programme Co-ordinator, devise a five-week programme of practical, fun and engaging photography-based activities for participants.
- Ensure activities are appropriate for the diverse needs of all participants in the room, including PAs.
- Liaise as required with project partners Aspex Portsmouth and Project Art Works as well as any specialist organisations, agencies (adult social care) and community groups.
- Working with the Learning/Curatorial team, foster new partnership opportunities with organisations.
- Ensure that all programme activity is documented.
- Contribute to ongoing monitoring, documentation & evaluation.
- Contribute to wider project dissemination activity (any additional expectation to attend events will be funded separately).
- Ensure all activities comply with Photoworks' rigorous safeguarding standards and paperwork is kept up to date. This includes consent forms and workshop/event registration procedures.
